- **3.** How does the relationship between Anuradha and Vardhmaan evolve in the house by the sea? What happens to their marriage, and what does this new stage in their life say about relationships, love, and responsibility?
- **4.** What is necessary to keep secure a marriage that has suffered astonishing tragedy? Is love enough?

5. In chapter fifteen, Nandini states, "I've been lucky enough to never love." Do you believe this is true?

think so?

its absence"? Do you agree with this statement?
