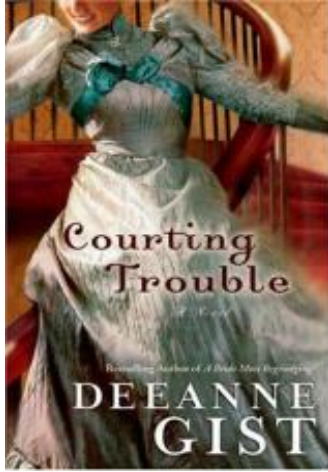


# Courting Trouble
