Discussion Guide

such a powerful force?

8. Khadi Faroughi and Hakeem Qasim have two very different views of Islam's teachings. What factors can cause such divergent opinions as to the practical outworkings of a single religious philosophy?

9. Are suicide bombers evil or are they simply deceived into a tragic action? What should our attitudes be toward them?

10. What is the one biggest difference between a life lived for true Christianity and a life lived for radical Islam?
