


Sunrise on the Mediterranean

Discussion Guide

4. What effect do you think the Ten Commandments has had on western civilization? While much of our culture's

thought processes come from the Greeks, what parts of government, organized religion and societal norms do we

attribute to the influence of the Ten Commandments?

5. For the first time, Chloe and Cheftu don't doubt each other and they find one another fairly easily-how does their

relationship change in the course of the story, and (if you read the two preceding books, Reflections in the Nile and

Shadows on the Agean) how has it changed in the course of the series?
